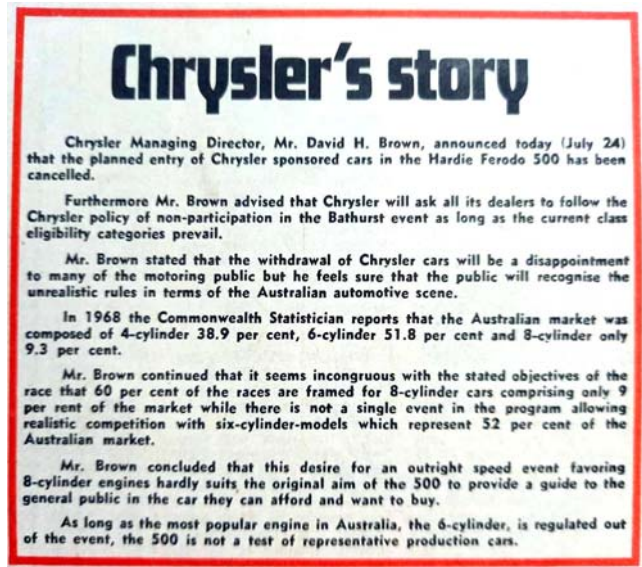

To enter by POST find the link to download the PDF entry form or ask a representative from your local state committee for a printed copy.

Once your entry and payment has been received and processed you will receive an Entry Confirmation letter (by email or post). Additional communications will be sent throughout the next year to provide additional Order Forms for your preferred meals, tourist site entry and merchandise requirements.

COVIDSAFE rally requirements will be met in 2022 based on government guidelines at the time. Refunds due to cancellation will be addressed based on circumstances accordingly so please do not hold back on submitting your entry.

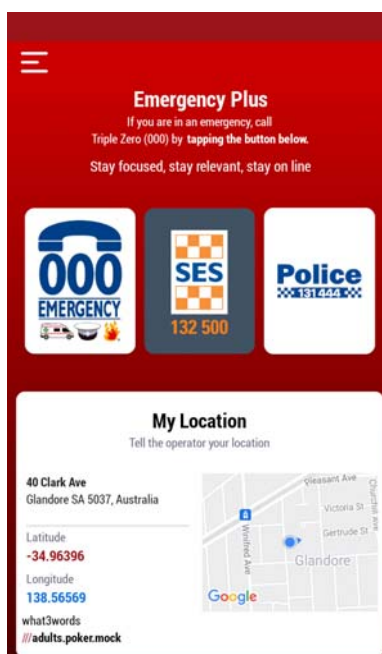

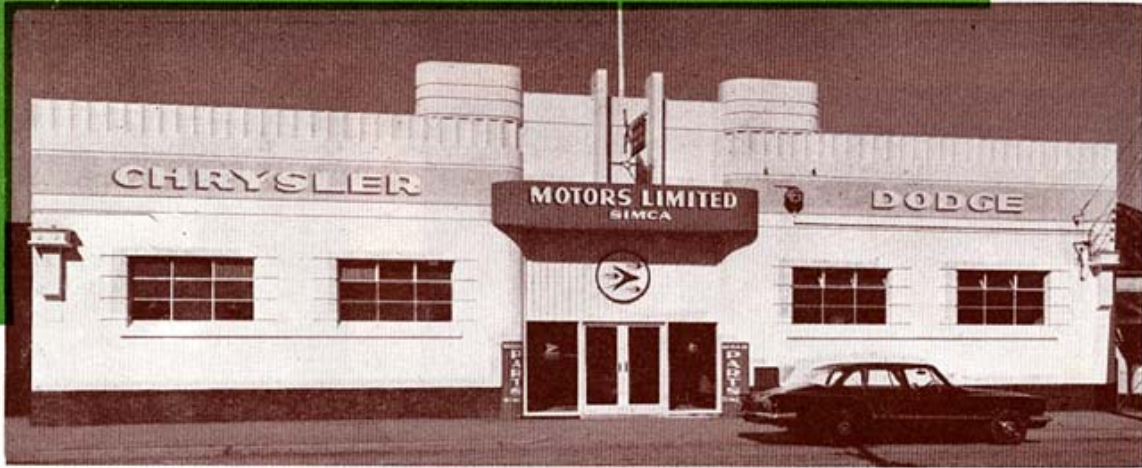

Motors Limited go Mopar in 1961

Meet the MoPar-Simca Distributor

In December, 1961, Motors Limited took over the Chrysler new vehicle and Mopar-Simca parts franchise from Waymouth Motors and Waymouth Service.

The transition period was highly organised and well carried out, with the minimum loss of services to dealers and the public.

The MoPar-Simca parts division of Motors Limited, now has a staff of 27, responsible for over £65,000 of parts and accessories contained in 12,000 square feet of space.

Country dealers have a special service provided. Instead of making their enquiries at the parts counter, they contact Mr. Fred Mole, the assistant parts manager, who arranges the services they require. A unique feature of the organisation, is the telephone order section, manned by five operators, who are in constant touch with city, metropolitan and country dealers, handling enquiries, receiving orders, and arranging any specialized services required.

(At right): Mr. Ray Trenouth, Manager, commenced employment with Mopar Distributor Waymouth Service Ltd. as junior parts assistant in September, 1933. 1954 saw Ray in charge of the MoPar parts department, and was subsequently appointed by Motors Ltd. as parts manager when the franchise was transferred. During the difficult changeover period he was greatly assisted by a small, but experienced, group of ex-Waymouth personnel who also gained positions with Motors Ltd.

Ray is married with four children, three girls and a boy. The two elder girls will be brides at a double wedding early this year. During the war he spent four years in the R.A.A.F. with three and a half years' service in the U.K. as captain and pilot of a Lancaster, and completed 32 missions over enemy occupied territory. He was awarded the D.F.C.

Les's Respray

While doing an article for the R & S Series Valiant Car Club newsletter I thought I would forward a copy to Richard to enable it to be added to a future Chrysler Collector magazine.

There has been some members getting their cars spruced up, like Tim Schapel's S Series which after an altercation with another vehicle received a full repaint. Member Les Johnson after seeing Tim's S decided to investigate refreshing his Green S. and after visiting Lobethal Auto Bodies and obtaining a quote to remove and repair rust in various areas the car was deposited with them for a repaint as well.



out old paint is removed to bare metal but on the sides of the car where paint was reasonable it is suitably treated and then over the lot is a full epoxy primer, filling primer and then 3 coats of 2 pack.



The story on Les's car is that he purchased it about 8 years ago and it was repainted about 10 years before that in 2 pack and was a daily driver. Both Les and I knew the painter and he confirmed it was a good example with very little rust but that at some stage after that it was involved in an accident where the front passenger door was replaced with another which was not as good as the old one and it was this door that was rusted.



I visited Lobethal Auto Bodies in late February with Les and took some photos of progress which shows back to bare metal where the paint was pitted down to the metal and repairs to passenger door rust, left hand "A" Pillar base rust, bottom of left and right hand doglegs and sill in front of the rear wheels and left hand guard bottom behind the wheel arch. Where repairs are carried

It was the accident which caused the rust in the left hand "A" pillar base and the patch up paint in the damaged sections was a mixture of 2 pack and acrylic. The car spent 2 years under a tarpaulin in an open carport at Blackwood before Les bought it and this damaged all the top surfaces under the tarpaulin but when it is finished it will look a million dollars in the same colour that Les's wife Kaye likes.

Another visit to Lobethal Auto Bodies occurred on Friday 10th of March found that painting was nearing completion with below painter Jim Cox

removing masking. Assembly of door handles, bumpers and lights will occur over the next week or so then it will be back home to Les's shed for all the stainless steel and chrome to be refitted after it has all been polished by Tim. It will then go back to Lobethal Auto Bodies for a final buff and the car then can be displayed by Les at a coming club run.
