It converts the phone's GPS location into a 3 word code which Australian emergency services can use to immediately locate the phone within 3 metres. Surely we should ALL have this App.

Continued from last issue

INT: And you, you've gone back to work Lorraine? [Editor – this is in the context of the story – ie decades ago!]

L B: When we came back to Adelaide, my aunty had just retired from Masterfoods and she spoke to the manager there and said if you like, I've got someone that will take over my job. So, I used to merchandise all the shops. I had a section of Adelaide to merchandise, Spices, Excelpet, and some of Mars and some of Uncle Bens. But over the years I became the supervisor for Masterfoods in SA and NT.

INT: And then in 1999, you both decided to retire.

T B: This is where Holdens were really starting to taper off and lowering staff levels. And the boss came up and he said, are you interested in retiring? He said we can do a package and they gave me all the numbers. I rang, Lorraine and said. What do you think?

L B: I said if you're going, I'm going.

T B: We went and saw the financial advisor. He looked at the numbers and said, Yeah, just do it. So I went back to work and said, yeah, I'll accept that.

L B: I'd been at Masterfoods for 20 odd years and they gave me a big send-off up in the Barossa

T B: Within a fortnight we'd both retired


INT: And then for your sins, you decide to go and look at classic motor cars.

T B: Well, with our motoring interest we thought maybe getting an old car and get involved with a car club and that'll give us something to do. There are other blokes I've seen retiring and they do

nothing. Anyway a mate said, if you're going to do that, don't get anything with side curtains. You get wet. Get something with wind up windows. We looked in some Restored Cars magazines. And the car we bought was advertised up in Brisbane. A friend of mum and dad went and looked at it. He didn't know much about it anyway. He said it looks alright so we bought it, without seeing it, which is probably not the smartest thing we've ever done. We did do that with a boat too.

L B: It arrived on a semitrailer out the front of our house. It looked alright but on inspection there was a bit of damage around the front mudguards.

T B: We've only had the car about 3 months. The Federation, we're doing a run to Canberra. We said, that's a good idea we'll go. There was a whole group from the Chrysler club, including Ken and Carol Barnes. That's when we met Ken and Carol and got friendly with them. There were 10 or a dozen cars going from the car club. So we packed a suitcase with some clothes



L B: No tools, no nothing.

T B: Back in those days, the RAA would support those runs. Day by day, cars are breaking down and these blokes fixed all the problems. Then Ken and Carol's car needed to be towed to Mildura for repair.

L B: They ended up in our car coming back to Mildura.

T B: We did that whole trip to Canberra and back without an issue and I reckon every other car on the run broke down around us. We got home and thought what bloody idiots are we? We've done all that 4x4 driving over the years. In those days you could build another car with heaps of tools and spares that we carried in the bush. We knew nothing about this car, owned it for three months and we've gone to Canberra and back with no issues, but times have changed, we carry a few bits now.

INT: We probably should say exactly what the car is.

T B: That's a 1936 C7 Chrysler Airstream

INT: Chrysler Airstream. So you you've joined the Chrysler Restorers Club and that would be 2000/1?

L B: 2001 I think it would have been

INT: 2001. So you've been around a while. And you've held many positions within the club.

T B: Not really.

L B: I was public relations for a few years.

T B: Yeah, I've. I've never been on the committee, no.

INT: And in 2010, you were the joint Directors ...

T B: The National Rally, yes.

INT: So I've got a long list of places you've been in this car; Tasmania, Canberra, Geelong, Wangaratta, Wagga Wagga, Albury/Wodonga.

T B: They're mostly the National Rallies.

INT: Around the Birdsville track, Alice Springs, Geraldton, WA via Esperance, Albany, Perth, Broken Hill, Mount Gambier, Port Lincoln and every National Rally since joining the club and many of the day runs. Yes.

L B: That's really what we have the car for.

INT: Absolutely. Just before we talk about the 2010 National Rally, is there a highlight from those early nine years with the Chrysler Restorers Club you can name?

LB: No.

INT: Are you not into naming inanimate objects?

LB: No. Well

INT: Which would be a memorable trip?

T B: Oh, probably the one to Tassie. Tattersalls rally. There were probably 20 cars from the Chrysler Club. It's the only time the car probably let us down with a blown head gasket at the end of the rally. Well, again the benefit of being an RAA Gold member.

L B: There were four of us travelling in the car.

T B: We had an off road camper that we were travelling with and using for accommodation. So we needed a vehicle that could tow the camper while we got the Chrysler fixed. So during the trip back to Launceston he said, how are you going to go about getting this fixed? I said I don't know anybody down here. He said I've got a mate with a workshop. If you like, I'll talk to him tonight. It was the weekend. The RAA had organised the tow and accommodation for us. They also organised a car for us to drive around in while the Chrysler was being fixed and could tow the camper so we could continue around Tassie. The tow truck driver said we'll leave your car on the truck and I'll contact my mate, which he did and he got back to me the next morning. The mechanic said he can fix it but he has to get hold of her head gasket. I rang John Biddle and told him what was going on and a day later the three head gaskets landed. So my car ended up at the workshop and the

RAA gave us a brand new Land Cruiser to continue. After 3 or 4 days of touring the mechanic rung me and said your car is ready. So we came back and left the Land Cruiser and picked the Chrysler up to return home.

INT: Wonderful story.

T B: It's probably more memorable for the car breaking down, but the trip itself is also very good. Other trips that have been good too over the time, like the RACV rallies in Victoria.

T B: That's probably where our prime objective with having a car or joining the car club was to be able to use the car and do runs and things and that that's probably what prompted us when the national rally came up.

INT: But it's a huge undertaking.

T B: The Committee we had was what made it. They were just brilliant. We began our planning after the National Rally in Canberra.

And the Chrysler people said, yeah, we'll give you the \$10,000 in three years time. So when you're home budgeting and trying to set stuff out, you would be aware, you know, the \$10,000 is handy in the budgeting.

There was an issue because as you're aware, come time for the rally national rally, the global

financial crisis occurred and this made the sponsorship unlikely, and we're waiting on this \$10,000 from Chrysler. Now in the three year period, the people we were talking to three years ago had all gone; one had been sent to America, one had gone to Mitsubishi or somewhere else in Australia. They had all left that Melbourne base

INT: Yes, Port Melbourne.

T B: We're now talking to people who've got no idea what we're talking about or what the commitments were 3 years ago.

L B: It's all a bit of a shock to the system.

T B: Which made it very difficult and essentially that \$10,000 was gone. So then we start thinking How are we going to budget around this? So you work all that out and work your rework budget and continue on planning the rally. About 3 or 4 weeks before the rally, we managed to get the 10 grand and I think we were the last people to get it.

INT: You we were indeed the last people to get it.

L B: We were able to give the people that were coming to the rally a lot more than we had actually planned in the cut back budget.

T B: Well, that whole \$10,000 went into discounts on the prices into venues. So everybody that

attended that rally got a benefit from that.

INT: And in the interim, the Mighty Chrysler has had a new paint job.

T B: So the first thing we did when we got it was I took all the four mud guards and the wheel covers, to MTA School for paint repair. At that time our son was

working at MTA. He was apprentice supervisor there and Mike Trengove, who used to be a member of the Chrysler Restorers club was the teacher in the paint shop. So between Corrie and Mike they were looking for things for the apprentices to do. I got another bloke to do the panel work. And the apprentices did all that painting at MTA. Then I reassembled it all. And that was when we first got the vehicle. Four or five years ago, we gave it another touch up. Greg Newly painted the body. I'd take a door down or a bonnet one bit at a time. If he had a clear hour or two, he squirted a bit of paint for me and eventually we got the whole car painted and so I'm forever grateful to Greg for doing that for us.

L B: When we first got it, all the



Chrome work was painted and so we had that all stripped and chromed. When we got it, it had Volkswagen tail lights and indicators which we have replaced with original equipment which was in the boot of car.

INT: So in the 23 years, say that you've been in the club with that car you've done 100,000 miles.

TB: Yes

INT: So that's around 160,000 kilometres or thereabouts which is more than many daily drivers do.

T B: Possibly,

T B: As I said earlier, our main intent in having the car was do rallies and do that type of thing and be involved in club activities.

INT: I mean, that's an extraordinary thing for a car

manufactured 1936.

T B: Hmm, 88 years old.

INT: It's done 100,000 miles since the year 2001. That's an extraordinary thing and a great testament. Well, let's say it's a great testament, firstly to Mr Chrysler and his engineering.

T B: Yeah, the motor was rebuilt. Yeah, that was just prior to the National rally.

INT: But secondly, you tow with the car, yeah, you you're not frightened to take it anywhere at all?

T B: Next weekend, we're going to Loxton.

Last weekend we were Mt Gambier. We've already booked in for the National Rally and Mildura at Easter

INT: Now you've also done several Bay to Birdwood runs.

T B: Pretty much every one since we've had the car. Three years ago was our last one. Actually last year we were in Port Lincoln. We did 2 Motorfest day runs this year.

INT: Now you are still vitally important to our club and still heavily involved in our club, Lorraine, you're doing the catering.

L B: I get the cups of tea out ready. Buy a bottle of milk.

INT: Often Trevor will talk about past runs and what have you in our meeting. So you're still both integral parts of the club life, you're still serial contributors..

L B: If you've got a vehicle like that, you've got to use it.

T B: What annoys me now if you organise a club run and you know the six cars that are gonna be there and people don't seem to be getting involved as much as they used to. However, having said that, the last couple of runs we've been on, the numbers have gone up. The Barossa was good. It had more people.

L B: Hamley Bridge was good.

T B: 14 cars for the calendar shoot was sort of a bit lean, but it was still a good day out. You know, if you're getting 14 or 20 cars or people attending, it makes it worthwhile. But if you only got 3 or 4 attending, so you think, why am I doing this for you?

INT: Absolutely. So is there any highlight of your time with the Chrysler Restorers Club of SA that you haven't touched on yet that you'd like to mention?

L B: I don't think so. Not really.

T B: We certainly enjoyed the company, the members and everything over the years. You're out with people. You're having a conversation.

L B: It's the same with any club really. Like the boat clubs. We've still got people that we regularly see.

T B: So it's enhanced our social life. I think that's important as you get older.

L B: We do things a bit slower now.

T B: If you're out, it doesn't matter what rubbish you're dribbling, does it, you're having a conversation.

INT: It's keeping the mind going round exactly.

L B: We're still involved with the Boat Club people. We're still involved with some of the guys that Trevor worked with. We go out for lunch with them sometimes.

INT: Excellent.

L B: Even though we're not involved in the 4 Wheel Drive, we're still involved with some of those people as well. You know, they've become long life friends.

INT: Now for your service with the Chrysler Restorers Club, you were both Awarded Life membership, yes?

T B & LB: It's not something you join the club for or try to attain but yes, very pleasing to receive it.

INT: Well, I think every thinking member of the club would say you both richly, deserved your Life Memberships.

INT: On behalf, of the Chrysler Restorers everywhere, thank you so much for hosting me today and agreeing to be part of our living histories.
